



ASTC TRAVEL PASSPORT PROGRAM EXCLUSIONS

The ASTC Passport Program, which is administered by the Association of Science Technology Centers (ASTC) in Washington, D.C., establishes the guidelines for museums to participate in this voluntary program. The Passport Program is intended to provide benefits to museum members of participating museums when they travel outside their home geographic area, while preserving the integrity and strength of the individual membership programs of museums that are located within the same region. The Mid-Hudson Children’s Museum strictly abides by the rules of the ASTC Passport Program, including requesting photo ID from all visitors, and enforcement of the 90-mile geographic exclusion.

Geographic Restrictions of ASTC Travel Passport Program:

1. Science centers and museums located within 90 miles* of the science center/museum where the visitor is a member
2. Science centers and museums located within 90 miles* of the visitor’s residents

*** PLEASE NOTE: This distance is measured “as the crow flies” meaning that is it based on the linear distance, not driving distance.**

The following museums are located within the 90-mile radius of the Mid-Hudson Discovery Museum.

- MHDHM Members, please note that you are NOT eligible for free admission at these museums
- Members of these listed museums are NOT eligible for free admission at the Mid-Hudson Discovery Museum through the ASTC Passport Program
